What to Do?

Link to Hope was established in 1991 in response to the devastating television pictures of the appalling conditions in Romanian orphanages. They currently work in Moldova, Romania, Bulgaria and the Ukraine. The work includes sending Christmas Shoeboxes to all of these countries. Link to Hope offers help to people of all backgrounds regardless of race, colour or creed with no qualifying criteria other than that they are poor and marginalised.
